

## Pardon Our Mess!

It's reorganization time at the BCPL! Those of you who have been in the Public Library in the past weeks may have noticed a lot of moving of shelves and materials. We apologize for the noise and inconvenience, but we think you will be very happy about the changes we have made. Here are some highlights:

- For you auto repair lovers, the repair manuals have moved in with the remainder of the Reference books in the 600s.
- The New York Times Index and Reader's Guide have been moved to the shelf along with the telephone books near the Reference desk.
- The Continuous Book Sale has been moved a few feet south to the shelves in the windows overlooking the Large Arch.
- Graphic Novels have been moved to shelves near the window area also.
- Soon the Nonfiction DVDs for adults and teens will be relocated to display units adjacent to the entertainment DVDs.
- Eventually, the paperback fiction books that have always been on spinners will be placed on shelves in the front window area that formerly housed Teen Fiction.

The real winners in this reorganization are teens. You may recall the last time I wrote a column, I said to teens, "We've got your back." And here is a prime example. Before, teens had to walk to the far corners of the main floor of the library to locate the Teen collections of fiction, nonfiction, audio books, magazines, and the graphic novels.

Now, these items are within steps of each other on the east side of the main floor.:

- Teen Fiction, Teen Magazines, and Teen Audio Books are located in the first two shelves in front of the Biographies.
- Graphic Novels and Hi/Lo books are now shelved just a few steps in either direction from the Teen Fiction perpendicular to the Teen Fiction. The Graphic novels are on the side closer to the main entrance and the Continuous Book Sale, while the Hi/Lo books are on the side closer to Adult Reference.
- Teen Nonfiction is located in the wall shelves that were formerly our Continuous Book Sale shelves.

We hope you are satisfied with the moves we have made, and if you need any help locating materials, don't hesitate to ask.

Finally, I'd like to point out the new book groups that we're hosting this summer.

- On June 25 at 6:30 PM, we are having a Bilingual Family Storytime for Spanish-speaking families.
- On Wednesday June 27 at 2 PM, we will have a Family Book Discussion of the book "The Lightning Thief" by Rick Riordan.
- On Saturday June 30 at 10:30 AM, we will have a Latino Author Book Discussion for 4th, 5th, and 6th graders. They will be discussing the book "Esperanza Rising" by Pam Muñoz Ryan.
